## NOWADAYS SPECIFICITY FOR UKRAINE

Basic geo-spatial peculiarities of any territory can't have further advantages per se, without involvement of appropriate resources (own or attracted) & renewing access to markets. At the same time neglecting by Technogenic-Environmental & other core preconditions brings to area damage & depression. Amount of own problems of Ukrainian areas (enough complicated on itself), is now *plus extra* affecting by heavy & harmful **current War impacts**, that also provoked unprecedented migration of population and relocations in Social-Economy sphere. As well as these phenomena are **combined with Global Climate, Energy, Food, Economy & Security crisis.**

Therefore we haven't appropriate experience **for dynamic behavior & decision making** under such circumstances and increasing whipping by obvious today & forecasting for tomorrow tremendous negative factors of russian aggression in Ukraine.

## **REGIONAL-BASIN'S DEVELOPMENT BOTTOM**

As important natural “pre-reasons” for any territorial-sectorial strategy & planning are **river catchments**, which embrace all Ukrainian regions in basins of Danube, Dnister, Western & Southern Bug, Dnipro, Don, as well as Seaside & Crimea's river areas and mountain systems, e.g. Carpathians.

# **URGENT OBJECTIVES & ALTERNATIVES**

- It's necessary ASAP return **multilevel water supply** for urgent needs **of nuclear power station** and population potable water availability, as well as for **main Ukrainian Grain Treasury watering**.
- USSR initial environmentally hostile design of destroyed obsolete reservoir combined with **disaster impacts** in few UA oblasts **in Dnipro and Black Sea basin**;
- What requires principally **new multidimensional systemic approach for spatial planning**, re-relocation both for population re-migration & manufacturing /technologic placing with crucial change of all previous life cycles

### *Press Statement on Climate and Security*

On 21 June, High Representative of the Union for Foreign Policy and Security Policy/Vice-President of the European Commission Josep Borrell, U.S. Special Presidential Envoy for Climate John Kerry, NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg, and Executive Vice-President of the European Commission Frans Timmermans, met in Brussels to discuss the impacts of climate change on peace and security.

They reiterated that climate change and environmental degradation are an existential threat to the planet, and also have immediate, direct, and growing negative implications for security and defence.

To that end, NATO and the EU will continue to strengthen their cooperation to address the security implications of climate change. Building on NATO's Climate Change and Security Action Plan, and the EU's upcoming Joint Communication on the impact of climate change and environmental degradation on peace, security, and defence, the EU and NATO will explore possibilities for an intensified dialogue on the impact of climate change and security.

In the lead up to this year's second annual NATO High-Level Dialogue on Climate Change and Security at the Vilnius Summit and the 2023 UN Climate Change Conference (COP28) in Dubai, they will seek to identify opportunities to cooperate on new insights and operational information about security aspects of climate change and environmental degradation, green standards, and energy efficiency, including to measure greenhouse gas emissions from military activities and installations with the goal of reducing these emissions.

Our first Executive Vice-President [for the European Green Deal, Frans Timmermans] is in charge of climate policy, and climate policy has security [implications].

I am in charge of Foreign [Affairs] and Security Policy, and I have to take into account the climate change as a source of insecurity. That is why we have been working together and presenting together this [Joint Communication](#) [on the climate and security nexus] from both point of views – climate [change] as a generator of insecurity and security policy taking account the climate constraints and policies.

We are here to discuss this emerging threat in our security.

Security has become a multidimensional concept. Energy security, economic security, climate security, [or] food security. There are a lot of issues that have "security" attached to them, which makes the work to fight against insecurity much more complex.

Bearing in mind the Stockholm Declaration of the United Nations Conference on Human Environment of 1972 and the Rio Declaration of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development of 1992;

Reaffirming the importance of the implementation of the political and legal commitments undertaken by the international community following those and subsequent conferences, especially at the Pan-European level;

Being aware that the 10-year review and evaluation of the Rio Declaration commitments and the implementation of Agenda 21 to be conducted at the World Summit on Sustainable Development in Johannesburg in 2002 will provide a momentous opportunity for further action to strengthen international co-operation towards coping with the challenges of sustainable development in the twenty-first century;

Being convinced that renewed efforts are required toward that goal on the part of all Carpathian and Danubian countries in a spirit of regional solidarity;

Upholding the principle of common, yet differentiated responsibility, to manage the environment and natural resources so as to promote sustainable development to the benefit of present and future generations;

Acknowledging that the Carpathian region is a natural treasure of great beauty and ecological value, a reservoir of biodiversity, the headwaters of major rivers and Europe's largest area of virgin forest;

Acknowledging also the special economic and social importance of the Danube River and its tributaries as a major European river with multiple uses and functions, as well as its ecological significance and its value as a natural habitat for numerous wildlife species;

Recognizing that a world wide scientific assessment of biodiversity by World Wide Fund for Nature identified the Carpathian Mountains and the Danube Delta as two of the world's most important ecoregions with a representative selection of the world's most outstanding and distinctive biological resources;

Being aware of the fact that efforts to protect, maintain, and sustainably manage the natural resources of the Carpathian Mountains and the Danube River Basin cannot be achieved by one country alone and require regional co-operation;

Emphasizing that cooperation on environment and sustainable development will assist the efforts towards stability and peace in the region;

Appreciating the efforts that have been undertaken at international, regional, national and local level to enhance co-operation and support for the maintenance and protection of the natural assets and resources;

Though the whole history of our Civilisation river basins acted as priority zones for the human development. Paradox of XXI century is that these zones look (from the anthropocentric point of view) like "noose of the neck" for further Sustainable Development.

In Legislation of many States definition "Natural Environment" was transformed though last decade into "Naturally-Anthropogenic" one. This change reflects attempts to find more precise equilibrium between the nowadays-economical development & future generation's survival [1].

River basins became the main "indicators" to attain such equilibrium. And their problems are focal for further Sustainable Development and for success of concrete modern approaches, such as Spatial Planning, Environmental Management, Technology Foresight, Pollution Prevention, Cleaner Production, Eco-efficiency, Life Cycle Assessment etc. In former Socialist Countries, and especially in their frontier Regions along the new EU & NATO border, these problems become more & more actual. Destroying of previous huge Economy and Legislation, used by authoritarian regimes, intensifying contradictions between the necessity of market transformations, regional policy, environmental & technogenic safety and obstacles of post-communist mentality [2].

New framework for further collaboration in these border areas was just established in Communication [3], aimed "to avoid drawing new dividing lines in Europe, promote:

- stability and prosperity within and beyond the new borders of the Union;
- integration into Transport, Energy and Telecommunications Networks and the European Research Area;
- closer economic integration and sustainable development, which will be provided by political support and assistance;

## Regional Water Resource Treatment and accompanied Disasters Prevention as core elements for Sustainable Spatial Development in the pilot Euroregion 'Upper Prut'

Nowadays concept on the Regional Sustainable Spatial Development can be considered as a composition of the Technology Foresight approach [1], modern understanding of the equilibrium between Economical & Environmental aspects of Mankind Activity [2-3] as well as new hierarchical vision of Safety as a multivariate process [4].

Last time these issues became very actual for the surroundings of the widening European Union & NATO under the new ideas of Neighbourhood [5].

Along the new EU & NATO borders Euroregions becomes "points of growth" for new European policy. And through them can be co-ordinated (and concentrated) the efforts of the Local, Regional, National Authorities & International Organisations, aimed to find systems solutions for the above mentioned problems.

Even the enumeration of the Euroregions in these area: "Neman", "Bug", Danube-Kris-Mures-Tisa", "Neisse", "Elbe/Laba", "Danube-Drava-Sava", "Upper Prut", "Lower Danube" etc. — allows to judge, which role plays today Water Resources and associated Security issues for the further Regional Development.




Fig. 1 Rivers system in the Euroregion "Upper Prut"



The World Bank will be working on the issues of regional development under the new CAS, and once we identify the areas for our cooperation with the Ukrainian Government in more detail, we would be happy to further discuss your proposals.

Meanwhile, we are beginning work on a new Country Economic Memorandum for Ukraine in which we will devote considerable attention to regional issues. A team led by Country Economist John Litwack would like very much to have the opportunity to visit Chernivtsi Oblast during the week of May 12. We hope that this time would be convenient for you, and we would appreciate your assistance in organizing this mission.



The programme will also support an inclusive labour market with a particular focus on vulnerable and disadvantaged groups

The **Interreg NEXT Romania-Ukraine** programme will mainly invest in inclusive education (e.g., infrastructure, educational plans, partnerships between institutions) and quality health care (e.g., establishment and modernisation of emergency services and mobile screening facilities). Investments in climate change adaptation, and protection of nature and biodiversity will address common problems such as forest fires, soil erosion, landslides, drought and floods that damage agricultural lands. The **Interreg NEXT Romania-Moldova** programme will invest in natural disaster risk prevention and resilience. Access to health care will be funded to address the disparities between rural and urban medical services in Romania, while Moldova will receive new high-end medical equipment. Finally, the programme will invest in tourism and culture, improving the access to historical monuments in the area.
